

**SUBAGREEMENT
MODIFICATION NO. 1**

WHEREAS, Johns Hopkins University (“JHU”) has embarked on a project entitled, “Bloomberg Initiative to Reduce Tobacco Use,” funded by Bloomberg Philanthropies (“Sponsor”) under its Grant (“Prime Award”); and,

WHEREAS, JHU has entered into a Subagreement with Center for Islamic Economics and Business, Universitas of Indonesia (“Subrecipient”) under Purchase Order # 2004243066; and,

WHEREAS, it is desired to modify this Subagreement,

NOW, THEREFORE, JHU and Subrecipient mutually agree as follows:

Clause 1. STATEMENT OF WORK is amended as follows:

1.1 Amend Statement of Work with the Statement of Work for which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A-1.

Clause 2. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE is amended as follows:

Delete the existing end date of “December 31, 2019,” and insert new end date December 31, 2020.

Clause 3. PRICE AND PAYMENT is amended as follows:

3.1 Delete amount obligated, “\$89,100 USD” and insert the amount, “\$172,600 USD” representing an increase in the amount of \$83,500 USD as reflected in Exhibit B-1, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Clause 11. CHANGES is amended as follows:

11.4 Subrecipient shall comply with the requirement that Subrecipient is solely responsible to ensure that any lower tier subrecipients comply with all obligations under this Subagreement. This requirement includes, but is not limited to, that requirement that lower tier subrecipients place the following acknowledgement in any publication from Subagreement funds:


do not necessarily represent the official views of Bloomberg Philanthropies or the Johns Hopkins University.”

**Scope of Work for Abdillah Ahsan
In relation to the
Development of the Indonesia Tobacco Control Research Network**

Terms of Reference:

In collaboration with the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health (JHSPH), the Center for Islamic Economics and Business, University of Indonesia, led by Abdillah Ahsan, will undertake work to enhance the development and sustainability of the Indonesia Tobacco Control Research Network (ITCRN) and expand tobacco control-policy related research in Indonesia. ITCRN has supported a number of policy relevant seed research grants and more recently undertaken measures to make this initiative sustainable.

Previously funded ITCRN grant recipients have published a number of research papers in various tobacco control journals. In 2018, two previous ITCRN grant recipients received funding support from Bloomberg Philanthropies to advocate for smoke-free areas, building upon their ITCRN funded research (i.e. assessing compliance with local smoke-free regulations in Aceh and Jayapura). Furthermore, two other ITCRN members used their research findings to help support advocacy efforts in Bantul and Tegal.

With a view towards sustainability, in 2019, a number of ITCRN researchers collaborated to develop proposals that were submitted to the Ministry of Education. One out of the seven research proposals that were submitted received a Rp 20 million grant through Penelitian Dosen Pemula (New Lecturer's Research Grant). The proposal, entitled "Non-Communicable Diseases Risk-Factors and Patterns of E-Cigarette Use Among Adolescents in Yogyakarta City, Indonesia" was developed by a team from Universitas Respati, Yogyakarta.

In 2020, the overall goal of ITCRN is to implement policy relevant research grant programs and ensure sustainability of the network. Moreover, ITCRN also aims to:

- Attract researchers from various universities in Indonesia to engage with the ITCRN
- Implement sustainability strategies
- Collaborate with policy makers and local BI Partners during the research process
- Communicate results of tobacco control-related research to policy makers and other tobacco control stakeholders with the aim of affecting policy development and implementation;
- Publish Indonesia-specific research results in international and national academic journals

Summary of activities

As noted in the budget, the Center for Islamic Economics and Business will undertake the following activities:

- a) Strengthen ITCRN network by holding a networking event involving all ITCRN grant recipients from the prior years. This event, held in conjunction with the dissemination conference for the 2019 grants, would establish a joint WhatsApp group as a means of letting members know of opportunities to attend conferences, seminars, and availability of research grants. The event will also be a place to update researchers on current issues in tobacco control, research ideas, etc. The longer term objective is to submit tobacco control policy relevant grants, involve the researchers in ITCRN’s activities, and help maintain the network.
- b) In 2019, the Project Director met with leaders at Sukabumi and Bengkulu cities in order to explore alternate sources of funding. This year, 3 other cities would be the main focus of these meetings, namely: Medan, Surabaya, and Makassar. We would collaborate with the Alliance of Governors for Tobacco Control to schedule these meetings. These meetings may help us identify sustainable sources of funding through local cigarette tax revenue dedicated to promoting public health initiatives.
- c) Provide 10 research grants to cover the selected proposals and monitor the related project implementation.
- d) Involve related policy makers in the research process from preparation, research design, research monitoring, report writing and publication.
- e) Submit joint proposals from government researchers, other academics, and relevant non-governmental organizations for government research grants or other university grants, especially for the non-competitive grants. For example, University of Indonesia has dedicated research grants for its lecturers and students. Moreover, collaboration with government researchers is encouraged to produce policy relevant studies. The aim is to encourage at least 3 government researchers to collaborate with ITCRN members and conduct studies. They will then become ITCRN members and tobacco control champions within their government unit.
- f) Continue and improve workshop proposals. Last year, there were 7 institutions that submitted their proposals to the Ministry of Education (MoE). This year, more participants would be encouraged, both ITCRN participants, and applicants. We will conduct 2 intensive workshops in Jakarta and Bali. The output of the workshop are proposals ready to submit for MoE research grants and University of Indonesia grants.

Project timeline – The overall time period covered by this Scope of Work will be from the date of signing through December 10, 2020. The general time line for project activities is as follows:

In case the current COVID-19 situation continues and travel restrictions persist in Indonesia, some or all of the following travel-related activities may not take place: promotional visit and networking visits (\$4200) [July 31 and October 10 deliverables]; proposal presentation to the review committee (\$5000) [July 31 deliverable]; collaborative project review (\$6000) [October 10 deliverable]; 2 MOE workshops (\$8040) [October 10 deliverable] ; and, advocacy visits to 3 cities (\$2160) [October 10 deliverable]. In case of such a scenario, JHU will withhold the funds where the associated travel-related activities have not been implemented. That being said, JHU strongly encourages Dr. Ahsan to aim to **remotely** undertake as many of these activities as possible.
