## Welcoming Speech

**Prof Dr (H C) K H Ma'ruf Amin**

Vice President of The Republic of Indonesia

Let us express our gratitude to Allah SWT, God Almighty, for His abundance of grace so that we can attend the Quacquarelli Symonds Higher Education Summit in the Asia Pacific region in 2022, which is held in collaboration with Universitas Indonesia in Jakarta. We should be grateful that after three years of being held virtually, it can be held on a hybrid basis in 2022. In the last two decades, there has been a significant increase in the number of students pursuing higher education globally. In 2020, the number reached more than 235 million students, while in 2000, only 100 million students were enrolled in higher education. At the same time, the amount of higher education institutions has also increased rapidly. Although the achievements are encouraging, there are millions of other students who have yet to be able to access higher education, and the opportunities are not distributed evenly.

While in fact, higher education plays a central role in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030, particularly in the target of achieving equal access to affordable and quality education for all. The role of higher education is also very critical for the collective creation of science and innovation. The hope is that various innovations that are applied in concrete actions and bring progress in the community will grow. During nearly three years of experiencing the Covid-19 pandemic, we have witnessed higher education institutions providing antidotes or concrete solutions to various global problems. One of them is the Covid-19 vaccine, which was successfully produced through a research collaboration that also involved people from higher education.



Connectivity and collaboration are becoming more unlimited with technology. The shift in community activities from physical space to digital space has been accelerated since the pandemic. Recent studies show that students and faculty demand the learning technology adopted during the pandemic continue to be utilized. For this reason, it is not enough for higher education institutions to be adaptive and responsive, it also has to be innovative and transformative.

Various literatures critically invite higher education institutions to review various scientific aspects to remain relevant. Starting from the taught concepts and theories, fields of study and learning curriculum, learning and research methodologies, to the governance of educational institutions. Higher education also needs to be responsive to the trend of world population growth, which again leads to equal access to education and inclusive learning opportunities. It is not only a matter of geographical range that needs to be anticipated, but also social class. Expanding access to open and equal education in the Asia Pacific region is not a simple matter. Moreover, this area is home to more than half of the world's population of student age. Indonesia also faces similar challenges, with its vast territory and many islands. Equitable access and improving the quality of education continue to be prioritized, including for the frontier, outermost, and least developed areas (3T). The Gross Enrollment Rate (GER) of Indonesian universities, according to World Bank data has only reached 36,31 in 2020, or below Singapore, Thailand and Malaysia.

Therefore, the Government of Indonesia is committed and working hard to develop the education sector from elementary to tertiary levels. Several breakthrough efforts have been taken. First, the existence of the higher education endowment fund to expand public access to higher education while encouraging more and more universities to enter the world rankings. This endowment fund facilitates various activities that support competitive and world-class higher education, such as research collaboration, student exchange, publication funding, graduate and post-graduate fee assistance, and so on. One example is the postgraduate scholarship program from the Education Fund Management

Institute (LPDP) managed by the Ministry of Finance. Since its launch in 2013 until 2020, the number of LPDP scholarship recipients has reached 27.995 people.

Second, the transformation of the education system through the Merdeka Belajar Kampus Merdeka (MBKM) program launched by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology. This program makes it easier for students to develop their capacity to compete and excel in the work and international arena. The MBKM program is the Government's commitment to unlocking students' capacity building by removing administrative restrictions. Starting from the internship, and student exchange, to independent study, the Kampus Merdeka activities can be converted into academic credits. In order to support MBKM, the Government has also launched scholarship programs, such as the 2022 Indonesia International Student Mobility Awards, which dispatched 1.565 undergraduate and vocational students to more than 110 world-class universities in 27 countries. I express my hope that various breakthrough efforts will continue, including strengthening the connectivity and collaboration among universities throughout the Asia Pacific. I also hope that more universities in Indonesia will be recognized as world-class universities. The key lies in continuous transformation, innovation, and collaboration. Through this forum, academics and education practitioners, especially universities, can share experiences and strategies. It is expected that continuous efforts to intensify cooperation in order to establish more world-class universities that are affordable for all will happen. Finally, with Bismillahirrahmanirrahim, I officially declare the QS Higher Education Summit: Asia Pacific 2022 Conference and Exhibition is open. May Allah SWT, the Almighty God always give His assistance and bless every endeavor that we do.

### Welcoming Speech

We are delighted to let you know that Universitas Indonesia is proud to be the main host of QS Higher Ed Summit: Asia Pacific 2022 on 8 – 10 November 2022. The QS Higher Ed Summit: Asia Pacific 2022 is going to be conducted in hybrid format in Jakarta for the first time, after three years of virtual summit due to Covid- 19 Pandemic in almost every Asia country. We are delighted that there is high level enthusiasm and participation in this year Summit as evidence that all 60 exhibition booth is fully occupied, more than 100 speakers will contribute in the debate within this summit, and around 1000 participants is confirmed, of which 600 of you join with me in person, in this auditorium.

This year's Summit give us an opportunity for us the discuss what is the role of higher education in the post-pandemic in developing globally competitive human capital in the Asia Pacific Region. Therefore, the theme "The Next Big Thing: Addressing new opportunities and existing challenges in APAC higher ed", is timely. This is to ensure that higher education institutions will still play a significant role to meet the Asia Pacific Industrial as well as public sector's human capital needs, through its academic, research, innovation and public service activities. It is also an honor for us that during this summit, the QS will reveal the latest QS Asia University Ranking 2023, which is the definitive performance benchmark for all the leading universities in Asia Region. In terms of performance in QS Rankings, UI has increased its ranking significantly, from rank 290 in 2022 to rank 248. This is the highest ranking that UI has achieved in the last one decade, positioned itself as one top three universities in Indonesia.

In addition, within the QS WUR by Subject 2022, UI has achieved

respectable result as the best comprehensive university in Indonesia. UI is the best university in Indonesia in three broad subject areas and 12 fields. Even the three disciplines achieve admirable result in Southeast Asia region. These three disciplines are Arts and Humanities (5th Southeast Asia), Life Sciences and Medicine (9th Southeast Asia), and Social Sciences and Management (5th Southeast Asia). Notable achievement in its ranking data management by UI was announced during 2022 QS EduData Summit (EDS) in New York. In QS EDS Summit 2022, it was announced that UI received an award from QS in the category of Recognition for Engagement. As the only University from Indonesia who received QS award from all categories, UI was awarded for its commitment in the engagement and data provision.

Universitas Indonesia is also one of global universities in its contribution for achieving the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through its activities and program in research, teaching and community development. As evidence in the latest Times Higher Education Impact Rankings 2022, UI continued to excel achieving its highest ranking ever by entering the top twenty in the world, which positioned UI as top three in Southeast Asia and number one in Indonesia. The Ministry of Education, Culture, Research and Technology, has launched its signature policy in higher education sector, known as *Merdeka Belajar, Kampus Merdeka* (MBKM) or Freedom to learn, Campus Freedom. The MBKM program emphasize in equipping the university graduates with soft skills and hard skills to be competitive human capital in the industry not just at national but also international level. There are a number of innovative initiative in MBKM, including Indonesia International Student Mobility Awards (IISMA), humanity project, teaching for elementary students and Village Development.

Universitas Indonesia is a strong supporter of MBKM program, for instance in 2022 through IISMA program, UI is the largest university in Indonesia that sent in total 221 undergraduate and vocational program students to 110 top 100 global universities in 27 countries. This universities, including University of Melbourne, University of British Columbia, University of Pennsylvania and University of College London (UCL). Not only UI excels in international ranking but

able to accomplish as the best performed University in Indonesia, based on the eight performance indicator (*Indikator Kinerja Utama – IKU*) by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology (*Kemendikbudristek*). The MBKM program is the basis of the eight IKU performance of universities in Indonesia. University of Indonesia's performance in this IKU ranking increase quite significant from number eight in 2020 to number one in 2021. The total score increased to 75, and the growth score increased by 515.

This Summit also coincides with the historic milestone of our country, during Indonesia presidency of G 20. The G20 is a strategic multilateral platform connecting the world's major developed and emerging economies to find solutions for world pressing challenges, including education issue. The Bali Summit on 15 – 16 November 2022, where all G20 head of states will gathered will be the highlight, after intense but productive ministerial meetings, Working Groups and engagement groups during the whole year.

As the main host of QS Higher Ed Summit: Asia Pacific 2022, it is also an important milestone for UI in the trajectory to be one of the leading Universities in the Asia. The Summit will be an important platform for UI and other Asia leading Universities to exchange ideas, increase global engagement, learn to each other and try to find solutions together for society and global problem, in terms of research and academic activity. Also, it is also expected that Universities, including that participate in this summit, need to ensure access to global high quality higher education to all, especially for the poor.

Beside involved in serious discussion about the faith of Asia Pacific's Higher Education in the future, during the summit we also like to introduce to you all in the hotel the delightful Indonesia culinary as you will experience during the lunch time in the next couple of days. For all the participants who already registered, we are looking forward to showcase UI's research facility as well as our Hospital who play a major role in public service during the Covid 19 pandemic for the last couple of years.

In the end we welcome all the university delegates as well participants from Higher Education Industry and hope you all not just to have a productive and constructive discussion during Summit, but also to experience the hospitality, rich culture and feel the dynamism of our historic capital city of Jakarta. ## Keynote Speech

**H.E. General (RET) Luhut Binsar Pandjaitan, MPA.**

First of all, I would like to congratulate for the trust given to Indonesia by having for the first time in hybrid format, the prestigious QS Asia Pacific Higher Education Summit 2022, which hosted by Universitas Indonesia (UI) and co-hosted by Prince of Songkla University (PSU). I am delighted that the Summit will facilitate discussion, networking and exhibition of around 1000 participants, including 700 people who attend live here in Jakarta, with 60 higher education institutions from all over Asia Pacific Regions showcase their marvelous program in education and research. For the past couple of years our government has been focusing in dealing with the Pandemic Covid-19, as with other nations. As the pandemic have recently subside, we need to refocus again to our effort in promoting the Renewable Energy, including in Asia Pacific Regions. The region comprises of more than half of global energy consumption, with 85% of that regional consumption sourced from fossil fuels. Meanwhile, the regional electrification rate reached 96.6 per cent in 2019.

With robust economic development, increasing urbanisation, Indonesia is the largest energy user in the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).

The country accounting for nearly 40% of total energy use among ASEAN members. Between 2000 and 2014, energy consumption in Indonesia increased by nearly 65%. According to recent estimation the energy consumption will grow another 80% by 2030. We already set an overall target to have modern

renewables (excluding traditional uses of bioenergy) provide 23% of total primary energy supply (TPES) by 2025, and 31% by 2050. The Reference Case, which assumes that these targets are met, implies a share for renewable energy of 17% in total final energy consumption (TFEC) by 2030, up from about 6% today. In the Renewable Energy issue, Indonesia have played an instrumental role at global stage. During Indonesia Presidency in G 20, after the closing of the G20 Energy Transitions Ministerial Meeting (ETMM) of Indonesia's G20 Presidency, the Bali COMPACT was agreed in early September 2022. The document contains basic principles to accelerate energy transitions which will serve as the foundation and reference for G20 member countries in an effort to accelerate energy transitions.

Besides Bali COMPACT, Indonesia also proposed the Bali Energy Transitions Roadmap as an initiative to provide continuity to the global agenda. The agenda aims to enhance the international cooperation and energy architecture. This roadmap provides the framework to accelerate energy transitions through three main priorities: securing energy accessibility; scaling up smart and clean energy technologies; and advancing clean energy financing. In order to meet this ambitious goal, higher education could play an instrumental role in accelerating the renewable energy transition. Higher Education have played a crucial role in enlightening society and change over the centuries. It needs to balance by maintaining their role as free and critical institutions, while also performing a service within societies for the better humanity. The Higher Education Institutions could play a big role in accelerating renewable energy transitions by moving towards inter- and transdisciplinarity in education and research in renewable energy issue; and play a much stronger presence in society in general through proactive outreach activities and partnering with other societal actors. The goal is to build awareness on the urgency for renewable

energy transition and to influence policy. Indonesia government have always encouraged higher education to play an important role the acceleration of Renewable Energy Transition. As part of *Merdeka Belajar Kampus Merdeka* or Freedom to Learn, Campus Freedom program, there is a program called *Gerilya*.



The *Gerilya* program give an opportunity to develop competency of renewable energy for universities students from vocational as well as Science and technology program.

As part of government effort in expanding academics and research activities related to renewable energy, Education Endowment Fund Agency (LPDP) provide Scholarship's scheme for master's and PhD program to study renewable energy in the best universities around the world. LPDP also provide research funding scheme known as RISPRO up to around US\$ 150.000 per research scheme that is focusing on renewable energy. As a result of this all-out effort by government and many important higher education stakeholders, several reputable international university rankings acknowledge the performance of leading Indonesia Universities at the global level for achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) including, renewable energy issue. The newly launched QS World Rankings: Sustainability 2023, put two Indonesia Universities, Universitas Indonesia (UI) and Universitas Gadjah Mada (UGM) in the rank of 281 – 300 in the world. Furthermore, in Times Higher Education Impact Ranking 2022 (THE IR), UI achieved the rank 18 in the world. This is an important milestone since for the first time that any Indonesia university has reached top 20 in the world since the ranking was released. Also, in the latest ranking of UI Greenmetric 2022, which measure sustainability policy in universities around the world, UI is in the rank 24, which also the best rank in East Asia regions.

I hope that all participants would be able to get the lessons learned from Indonesia on how government, higher education institutions and other important stakeholders collaborate for the sake of humankind. This constructive collaboration is for the noble purpose of accelerating transition to renewable energy to make a better world by 2030 as stated in SDGs, which is recognized at the international level. I would like to end my speech by wishing all of you to have productive and constructive discussion during QS Asia Pacific Summit 2022.

## SPEAKERS

### **Prof Dr (H C) K H Ma'ruf Amin**

Vice President of The Republic of Indonesia



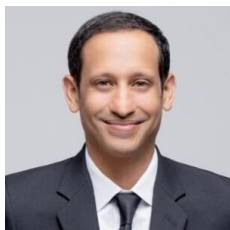
Professor Amin, born in Tangerang on March 11, 1943, is an Indonesian politician, a highly respected Islamic cleric, and the 13th Vice President of the Republic of Indonesia after being elected together with President Joko Widodo in the 2019 Presidential Election. Before being in top executive position in government, Prof. Amin already had an extensive legislative experience from 1971 to 1999. He has held various positions, from the largest Islamic Mass Organization Nahdlatul Ulama (NU), the chairman of the Indonesian Ulema Council (MUI), to Pancasila Ideology Development Agency (BPIP) Steering Committee member. His political career started in 1977 when he was elected as a member of the United Development Party (Partai Persatuan Pembangunan or PPP) for one term (1977–1982) in the Jakarta City Council and served as the leader of the PPP caucus. Then in 1989, he was appointed as a katib' aam, a senior position within NU's syuriah, its supreme governing council. He then rose to be one of the raises of NY a leader overseeing the executive leadership of the legendary and highly respected Islamic cleric Abdurrahman Wahid. Following the fall of Suharto in 1998, Ma'ruf became an advisor to Wahid's



National Awakening Party (Partai Kebangkitan Bangsa, or PKB) and advised Wahid throughout his presidency of Indonesia from 1999 to 2001. Professor Amin returned to active politics and represented PKB in the House of Representatives of the Republic of Indonesia (DPR) from 1999 to 2004. During his second term in DPR, Prof. Amin chaired the Fourth Commission (agriculture, food, and maritime affairs) and was a member of the Second Commission (government affairs and regional autonomy) and the Budgetary Board. He also chaired the Ulema Council's committee in charge of issuing legal opinions (fatwa). He did not seek re-election to the DPR in 2004 and returned to MUI to chair its National Sharia Committee (acting from 2004 to 2010). He also served as an advisor to President Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono in his Presidential Advisory Council from 2007 to 2014. From 2015 – 2019, Prof. Amin was in the position of Rais 'Aam, equivalent to the chair of the supreme governing council, of the NU.

**Nadiem Anwar Makarim**

## Minister of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology of Indonesia



Nadiem Anwar Makarim started attending an elementary school in Jakarta, then graduated from a senior high school in Singapore. From Singapore, he continued his undergraduate studies in the International Relations department at Brown University, USA. He took part in foreign exchange at the London School of Economics (LSE) for a year. He continued his study at Harvard Business School and graduated with an MBA (Master of Business Administration). Nadiem is known to have spent three years working at McKinsey & Company. It is also known that he had worked as the Co-founder and Managing Editor of Zalora Indonesia, and not long after that, he became the Chief Innovation Officer of Kartuku. His entrepreneurial career started when Nadiem founded a company named GOJEK and became its CEO in 2010. GOJEK was first established as a call center, offering only courier delivery and two-wheeled ride-hailing services. Today, GOJEK has transformed into a super app, providing more than 20 services, ranging from transportation, food delivery, groceries, massage, house cleaning, and logistics to a cashless digital payment platform called GOPAY. Currently, GOJEK is a decacorn company with a valuation of over US\$10 billion. His innovation and social transformation entrepreneurship in GOJEK won him many prestigious accolades, including the

Straits Times Asian of the Year award (2016); Bloomberg 50 annual list of innovators (2018); the youngest figure from Asia to receive the 24th Nikkei Asia Prize for economic and business innovation (2019); and the only Indonesian to be included on 100 Next lists for Leaders category by the Time magazine. Gradually, Nadiem's role as a businessman began to appear close to palace circles, especially with the President of Indonesia. Several times Nadiem dared to invite the head of state to an official GOJEK event. Back in October 2015, Nadiem also accompanied Jokowi when he visited Silicon Valley in the United States. Valley. However, his choice to accept President Jokowi's offer to enter the Indonesia Maju Cabinet eventually forced him to quit GOJEK. In October 2019, Nadiem officially no longer served as the CEO of GOJEK and chose to focus fully as the Minister of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology. As the youngest minister in the history of the cabinet of the Republic of Indonesia government, Nadiem Makarim launched his signature policy in higher education known as Merdeka Belajar, Kampus Merdeka (MBKM) or Freedom to learn, Campus Freedom. The MBKM program emphasizes equipping university graduates with soft skills and hard skills to be competitive human capital in the industry not just at the national but also international level.

## Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs and Investment

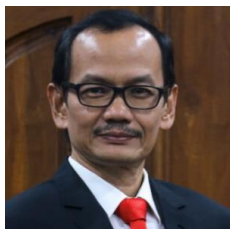


Luhut Binsar Pandjaitan, MPA, is an Indonesian politician, businessman, and retired four-star Army general, serving as Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs and Investment since October 2019. He previously served as Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs from July 2016 to October 2019, as Coordinating Minister for Political, Legal, and Security Affairs from August 2015 to July 2016, and as Chief of Staff to President Joko Widodo. He was also Minister of Trade and Industry in President Abdurrahman Wahid's cabinet and Indonesian Ambassador to Singapore from 1999 to 2000. Luhut entered the Indonesian Armed Forces Academy (AKABRI) for the Army section and three years later won the title of Best Graduate in 1970, thus earning the Adhi Makayasa award. Luhut's military positions in Indonesia Military Service (TNI) included Commander of the Army's elite Special Forces (Kopassus) Group 3, Commander of the Infantry Weaponry Center (Pussenif), and head of the Army Education and Training Command (Kodiklat). He was the founding commander of Detachment 81 (now Sat-81/Gultor), the counter-terrorism unit of Kopassus. While serving in the military, Luhut earned his extensive military education from the Indonesia Armed Forces and abroad including, Airborne Course, Best Graduate, Reaching Umbrella Gold Trophy Award (1971); Command Course, Best Graduate, Reaching Beyonet Silver Award

Command (1971); Kecabangan Infantry Basic Course (SUSSARCABIF), Best Graduate (1971); Officers Advanced Course / SUSLAPA I (1976); and Officers Advanced Course / SUSLAPA II (1978). In 1991, Luhut graduated from George Washington University in Washington D.C. with a Master's degree in Public Administration (MPA). At the same time, he graduated from the National Defense University in the same city. Luhut earned numerous accolades in his military services, including Garuda VIII Loyalty Insignia; Kartika Eka Paksi Achievement Star; Kartika Eka Paksi Nararya Achievement Star; United Nations Honor Insignia; Upholder Insignia; and Yudha Dharma Nararya Star.

**Prof. Ir. Nizam, M.Sc., DIC, Ph.D., IPU, ASEAN.Eng.**

Director General of Higher Education, Research, and Technology (Dirjen Dikti Ristek), Indonesia



Prof. Ir. Nizam, M.Sc., DIC, Ph.D., IPU, ASEAN.Eng. is a full-time Professor of Civil Engineering at Gadjah Mada University (UGM). He earned an Engineering degree from the Faculty of Civil Engineering, Gadjah Mada University, and continued his Master's and Doctoral programs at the Imperial College of London, in Coastal Engineering. Prof. Nizam was appointed as Director General of Higher Education (Dirjen Dikti) on July 21, 2020. As of August 2021, he continues to serve as Interim (Plt.) Director

General of Higher Education, Research, and Technology (Dirjen Dikti Ristek). He is one of the people who participated in the core team drafting the Law on Higher Education in 2012, the Law on Medical Education in 2013, and the Law on Engineering in 2014. His experience in the field of higher education management is quite extensive. He served as Secretary of the Council for Higher Education (DPT), the Ministry of Education and Culture from 2008-2013. He held the position of Head of the Center for Educational Assessment at the Ministry of Education and Culture from 2013 – 2017. He was also a Dean of the Faculty of Engineering at UGM from 2017 – 2020. His academic achievements have won him many awards, including Best Paper, 21st International Congress Asia and Pacific Division, from the International Association for Hydraulics Research (2001), Honorary Professor Award, ASEAN University Network – AUN, Chulalongkorn University, Hewlett Packard Award for e-learning (team member) (2007), and the honorary medal from the President of the Republic of Indonesia, Satyalancana Karya Satya (2012).

Chief Sector Officer, Sustainable Development and Climate Change Department, Asian Development Bank (ADB)



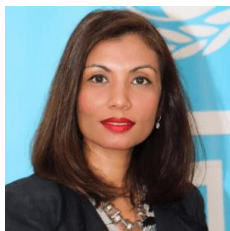

**Prof. Dato Mohd Ekhwan Hj Toriman**

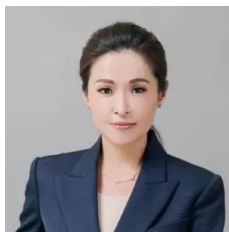
Vice Chancellor, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia
